It probably is true that within every generation some people have looked around in their later years, and wonder what's happening to this world? As years have slipped by in the recent past this may seem especially true. Each year seems to speed up the rate of change.

About 1987 it was my pleasure to listen to a video tape, (yes, for many of us this may be like a trip in the Way-Back-Machine), of a professor who studied and taught about change. A couple of things that stuck with me were the following:

- 90 to 95% of all recorded history about change had been written within the life time of his grandmother. It's beyond me how we might verify that, but he had a very convincing set of reasons for this being the case. Maybe she was very old, because this guy was not young.
- The rate of change that existed at that time would increase by 500 times during the next 20 years. That one seems to have taken place. It leaves me wondering what the rate of change might be today.
