It's enjoyable, being with people whose joy flows out of them like a river. One such person is a dear friend of mine who tends to cry easily about God's love. We can be sitting down, talking about the Lord, and her tears just start flowing.

Some might say she is over sensitive, or over reactive. For her that is not the case. It's the result of how much she loves Jesus!

"Living a faithful life in Christ is one of the simplest things we can do." Sounds crazy, doesn't it? Well, let's forget about all our failed attempts at being faithful to Jesus, and consider this crazy idea together.

If we could change the way we think and our resulting perspectives. If we could quickly forget what we think we know about living on this earth. Then following Jesus would be simple.
