
The Growth Spiral of Love: Our Love of God


"For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish, but have eternal life." (John 3:16)



(New Perspectives)

By this new perspective, a view from redemption, we are able to be led in righteous self-love. This is a love which is not based upon the values of the world, but upon the Love that God has for us, and the new life that we have in Christ.




(Righteous Self-Love)

(Obedience)



In Christ we have gained a more correct view of ourselves. The same worth that we know we now have in Christ, we see in others. The value of their lives increases for us, as does the importance of other's needs.



We can give this to them in the love of God because God has given it to us, and through this giving and receiving process we grow in our love for God.




(Love Others)


This brings us back to the first experience with the love of God, which is, learning that God loves us. Only now we know much more about that love.

(Completes the Spiral)

At this point you may be asking, "Well if it happens this easily then why isn't it happening to me?" One thing I have never experienced is "instant growth". Just add water and poof there it is! I'm lazy enough to wish it were that easy. Better sense tells me my active participation is necessary to live in the fullness of Life in Christ, and it takes more than just simple processes. Life is complex as this last drawing illustrates.



We are complex people with many interconnections between our thoughts, ideas, concepts, feelings, and actions. Nothing happens in a relationship just one simple step at a time, but as we grow in Christ we will learn to love God more and more. We will experience patterns of growth in our new Life in Christ.
